You must tell your neighbours if you want to carry out any building work near or on your shared property boundary, or 'party wall', in England and Wales. Party walls stand on the land of 2 or more...

Party walls and building work - GOV.UK
The key things to remember are which walls constitute as 'party walls' and the type of work subject to the Act. Walls and other built elements include: floors and ceilings between flats; shared boundary walls, such as those between semis and terraced homes; any other walls which touch the boundary are covered.

Preventing and resolving disputes in relation to party walls
A 'party fence wall' is not part of a building. It stands astride the boundary line between lands of different owners and is used to separate those lands. Wooden fences, or even fences with concrete posts, are not party fence walls. What is a Party Wall? - My property guide
Work in the garden covered by the Party Wall Act include: To demolish and/or rebuild/build a party boundary wall. To increase the height or thickness of a party boundary wall. Excavations within 3 metres of a neighbouring building where the excavation will go below the bottom of the foundations of the neighbouring building.

The Party Wall Act and how it affects boundary walls
A party fence wall is a wall which stands on the land of different owners and is used for separating adjoining lands but does not form part of a building. If the wall is only on the land of one owner it is not a party fence wall under the Party Wall etc. 1996 Act. If you wish to carry out certain work to a party fence wall then you must serve notice on the adjoining owner the same as you would if you wanted to do work to the party wall separating your houses.

Party Fence Walls and fences explained, Manchester Surveyors
A party wall is the shared wall, usually between a terrace or semi-detached house, and divides the homes of two separate owners It also includes garden walls built over a boundary and excavations close to a neighbour's property (within three or six meters, depending on the depth of the new foundations).

A 'party wall' or 'party separating wall' is the dividing wall between two attached dwellings Many existing party walls have been built with a cavity to reduce sound transmission between the buildings This cavity can allow cold air from outside to circulate and steal heat from adjoining buildings

Identification of party wall construction type
A party wall functions as a boundary between two or more properties that are owned by different people. If you live in a flat, you will share your walls, and possibly floor or ceiling, with other property owners and the Freeholder – these are all classed as party structures.

A party wall (occasionally parti-wall or parting wall, also known as common wall) is a dividing partition between two adjoining buildings that is shared by the occupants of each residence or business. Typically, the builder lays the wall along a property line dividing two terraced houses, so that one half of the wall's thickness lies on each side. This type of wall is usually structural.

How to Soundproof a Party Wall - Noisestop Systems
A wall is a "party wall" if it stands astride the boundary of land belonging to two (or more) different owners. Some kinds of work carried out to a property may not be controlled by the Building Regulations, but may be work which is covered by the Party Wall etc. Act 1996. This is a separate piece of legislation with different requirements to the Building Regulations.

Party Walls | Other permissions you may require | Planning ...
Party Walls According to Section 38 of the Law of Property Act 1925 if " a wall or other structure is or is expressed to be made a party wall or structure, that structure shall be and remain severed vertically as between the respective owners, and the owner of each part shall have such rights to support and user over the rest of the structure ".

Walls and boundaries - Boundary Walls
The Party Wall Act 1996 looks at two different types of Party Walls: Type A is when a wall stands astride the boundary of the land which belongs to two or more different owners. This can include walls which are separating terraced or semi-detached houses (known as the party wall) or between two gardens in masonry (known as a party fence wall).

Why you have to pay to use your neighbour's wall? | Party ...
Party Wall A partition erected on a property boundary, partly on the land of one owner and partly on the land of another, to provide common support to the structures on both sides of the boundary. Each person owns as much of a party wall as is situated on his or her land.

During the process of undertaking the loft extension, the building owner will be exposing the Party Wall and as such the Party Wall etc Act 1996 enables a building owner to do this, subject to providing adequate weather proofing.

Party walls usually separate buildings belonging to different owners but could include garden walls built astride a boundary – known as party fence walls. Where a wall separates two different size buildings often only the part that is used by both properties is a party wall, the rest belongs to the person or persons on whose land it stands.
